

Understanding the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on seafarers

Kia ora,

My name is Maria Borovnik, and I am a Senior Lecturer at the Development Studies programme at Massey University, in New Zealand. I have worked with seafarers and their families since 1999, mostly in Kiribati and Tuvalu.
